## **About our College**

Endeavour Christian College is a Prep to Year 12 independent, co-educational Christian school serving in Far North Queensland. Our College is situated in Cooktown and draws from a large catchment area in the region. Endeavour College was founded in 2012 and has been working with families to make values-based Christian education available to all who desire it. Endeavour Christian College is owned and operated by Christian Community Ministries (CCM). We are one of 13 CCM schools across Australia. Our mission is "educating for eternity; equipping for life" and our school motto is "All things through Christ."

Our College is committed to working with parents to educate their children. In providing an education presented from a Christian worldview, Endeavour recognises the importance of educating children holistically in the social, emotional, physical and spiritual aspects of their lives.

As our mission states, our aim is to partner with parents to engage and equip students for a life beyond school. From Prep to Year 12 we offer students the opportunity to belong to a Christian learning community that celebrates and cares for them as unique individuals, enabling them to be their best.

The culture of the College is very encouraging and supportive, where students can develop a strong sense of purpose through the varied experiences and the learning programs. Students can develop an individualised learning pathway through the middle and senior years of school. This includes subject offering combinations of onsite, offsite and remote subjects, school-based apprenticeships and industry-based VET certificates. We know that a 'one size fits all' approach does not work so providing multiple learning pathways to achieve success is of the utmost importance to us.

All of our teachers are committed to encouraging each child to experience the love of learning and to develop their individual talents and gifts. We want to see all our students find their passion in life so they can use the gifts they have been uniquely given to make a positive difference in our community, state, nationally and even internationally.

  The program also enhances students' 21st-century skills.







#### **Extra-curricular Activities:**

Endeavour has a vibrant, engaging and highly relational school culture. This unique culture has been nurtured and highly valued by our staff and community. Student welfare and pastoral care form an integral part of our school culture. We care for our students emotionally, socially, academically, and spiritually. The staff continue to model and encourage students to display Christian values of kindness, respect, honesty and integrity. Having a Head of Student Welfare has helped to underscore these values throughout the school. Daily Pastoral Care classes allow opportunities for staff to gauge how students are 'travelling' and to help whenever possible. 

#### Parent, Student and Staff Satisfaction

Endeavour Christian College is committed to continuous improvement of the educational experience of our students. Ensuring a high level of satisfaction among the school community is of high importance. Satisfaction feedback from parents is sourced both formally and informally. In 2023 families indicated a high level of satisfaction that their child is safe, cared for and respected at the College. The College's approach to dealing with bullying and the College's ongoing zero-tolerance approach towards bullying received high satisfaction ratings from families. Families indicated that their child/ren experiences a sense of belonging at the College and that the College has a warm atmosphere and a supportive environment. The overwhelming message from feedback is positive, supportive, and appreciative. The feedback is helpful, affirming, and includes some constructive ideas on various matters. Parents are generally very complimentary of teachers. There was consistent recognition of the dedication and the commitment of the teaching staff to ensuring students were cared for. On the whole, parents felt well-informed and believed that they could access information from the College if they required it.
